Nancy is a retired elementary teacher. She has years of experience using Mac programs, creating phenomenal learning experiences for her students and our St. Paul's members.

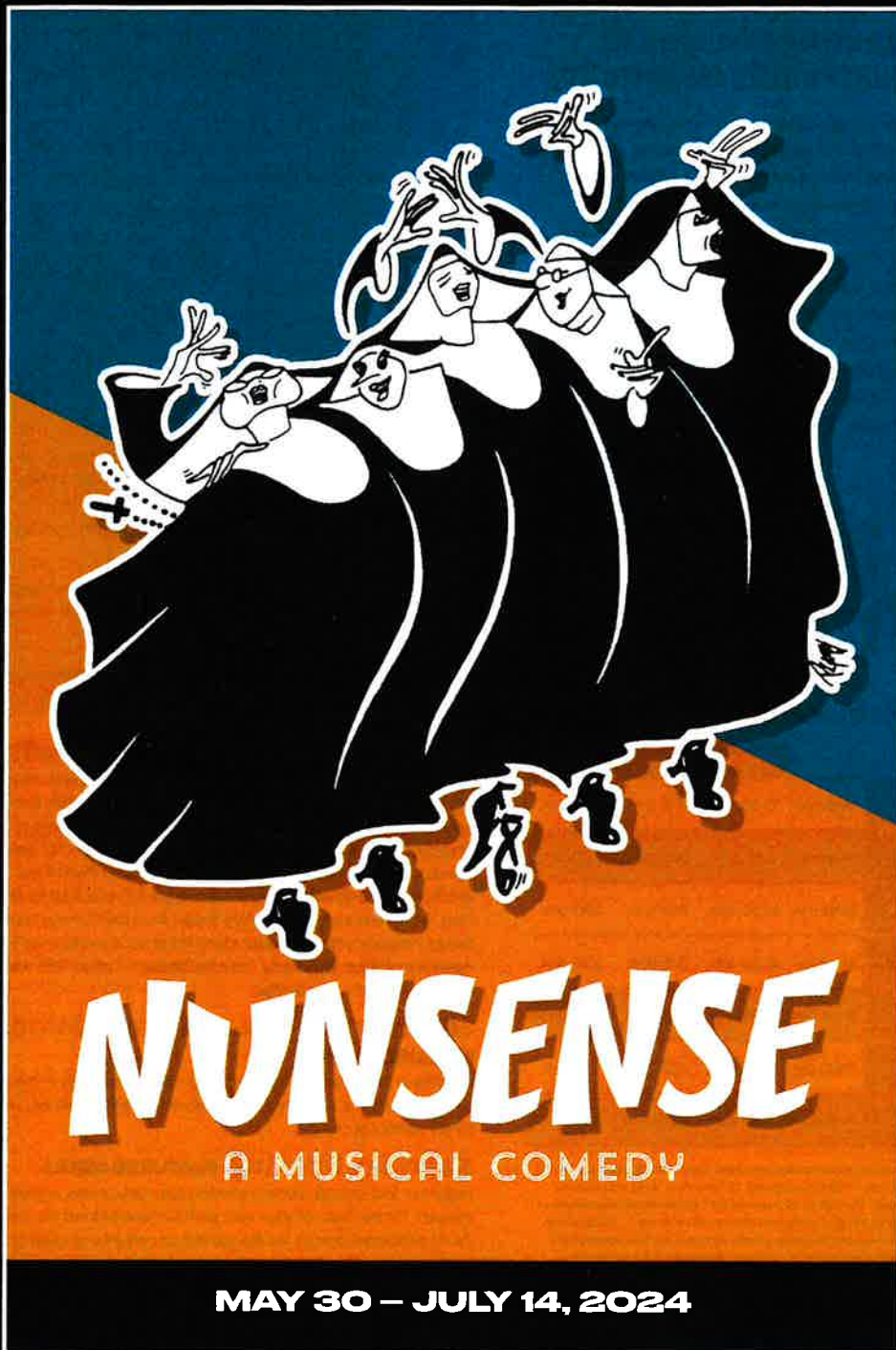

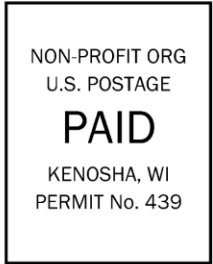
