

#### **EMAIL AND TEXT SPOOFING AND SCAMS**

More and more congregations, and ministries are being targeted by scammers and phishing attacks. These emails or text messages often pretend they are a pastor or bishop and ask for private conversation, or the need to for a favor, or to purchase gift cards.

These attacks are a phishing or spoofing scam. This means that the email account or phone number has probably NOT been hacked. Attackers are using an alternate email address or phone number and contacts found using A.I. software.

This kind of attack is often called CEO Phishing or Business Email Compromise. In 2019, the FBI reported that this is a \$26 billion scam.

#### **HOW TO AVOID OR STOP SCAMS**

1. Check the email address or phone number that sent the message. Modern email programs often only display the name as a default and not the email address. The attackers use this to their advantage and create addresses with the real name but use a bogus email address.

**HOW IT WORKS** 



The attackers decide on a target (a congregation, ministry or synod) and does a search for names and email addresses of leadership.



The attackers create email addresses with a convincing name or domain to look similar to that of the leadership.



They then use software to find email addresses or phone numbers associated with their target.




They send emails or texts to the found addresses posing as a pastor or bishop to solicit money or information.

Often using gmail or yahoo accounts. Text scammers will use area codes that are in the area you are in, claiming it is a new phone number.

- 2. Look for red flags in the tone and grammar of the email or text. Attackers will want to create a sense of urgency, to prey on your desire to help. They will often claim the bishop or pastor needs something and is in a meeting. Or needs to urgently have a private conversation. These emails will often contain misspellings, strange punctuation, or grammar that is just "off" a bit. Read messages with requests carefully.
- 3. **Ask someone.** Have someone else read the message for you to see if they notice anything weird. Call or email the church or synod office to check what the email address or phone number of person actually is.
- **4. Do not purchase gift cards or give out information.** These scams often ask for the purchase of gift cards or want you to provide further information (for more scams). Never share information or make purchases from a text or email request without verifying information.
- **5. Report it**. Report it to the person or leadership, the chances good that if you received a scam email or text, someone else did too. Also report it to the FCC. If you are the victim of a scam, report it to local law enforcement.

Dear friends,

I want to tell you about Christine\* who lives in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. Last year, Christine lacked stable housing and often wondered where her next meal would come from. She is one of my close neighbors, and that's why I want to share her story.

We know the parable of the good Samaritan. We hear Jesus calling us to show up for all our neighbors, no matter where they're from or where we meet them. We see the needs of our neighbors across the globe. But we don't always recognize the needs of people right in front of us, such as Christine, who struggle to find healthy food and safe, stable shelter.



Your generosity to ELCA World Hunger can provide food and safe, stable housing for your neighbors nearby, in places such as rural Michigan and around the world.

ELCA World Hunger gives us a way to come together as church and meet needs we can't see as individuals, in ways we haven't imagined. Your gifts to ELCA World Hunger can reach your siblings in Christ who are caught in a cycle of hunger and poverty — half a world away and just down the street.

A little over a year ago, Christine was staying in a women's shelter in a rural area where grocery stores are miles apart. Often there's no way to get to them without a car. Even if Christine could have found groceries, she had no place to store or prepare food.

Things began to change when Christine connected with the Welcome Home program, administered by Lutheran Social Services of Wisconsin and Upper Michigan and supported by donors such as you. Gifts to ELCA World Hunger go to work through caseworkers who get to know each Welcome Home participant and help them secure permanent housing, as well as other resources to sustain them long-term such as education, job skills training, and mental and physical health care.

Because housing and food insecurity are deeply intertwined, the program addresses both. Participants can access a food pantry, receive vouchers to local grocery stores and take classes on how to prepare nourishing meals.

When you give to ELCA World Hunger, you provide food and so much more. You can meet the most pressing needs of people such as Christine and help them access the tools they need to thrive for years to come.

Christine's caseworker helped her find a one-bedroom apartment. Christine also received some items to help make her house a home, such as dishes, cookware, blankets and towels. The food pantry and a grocery store voucher helped Christine fill up her refrigerator and kitchen cupboards.

A little while later, Christine's daughter lost her housing as well. With help from program staff, Christine was able to add her daughter to her lease so the two of them could live under one roof. Her daughter got help securing a copy of her birth certificate and a driver's license, which will make it easier for her to access resources and job opportunities.

## To people such as Christine and her daughter, a gift of any size can make a big difference. Will you donate to ELCA World Hunger today?

Christine's journey toward permanent housing isn't over yet. Her current apartment needs to be renovated, so her lease can't be renewed. But you can accompany her and her daughter as they search for a new place to call home.

You can also reach Christine's neighbors who are still struggling to access food and housing. The number of people experiencing homelessness in Christine's county has doubled since 2020, and the demand for Welcome Home services is greater than the program's resources. Sometimes it lacks enough fresh produce for everyone in the community who needs it. You can help provide the essentials needed by your neighbors in Wisconsin and beyond.

With your support, our church can work together to answer Christ's call to "go and do likewise," showing up for all our neighbors who endure hunger and poverty. We can walk with them toward a just world where all are fed.



#### ST. PAUL WINDOW

St. Paul is represented by the red sword of faith, turned down in peace instead of upheld for war. The open bible with the words "Spiritus Gladius" (Sword of the Spirit) also represent his new battle for the faith. The red crosses in the surrounding background signify the Seven Churches of Asia to whom he carried Christ's message.



#### **HOLY TRINITY WINDOW**

The three persons of the Holy Trinity are represented by a sunburst of light (God the Father,) a cross (God the Son,) and a dove with rays (God the Holy Ghost.)

Both windows contain a golden field of color against a silver background. Gold is symbolic of praise and joy....our thanksgiving for being children of God.

### Dalle de Verre Glass Restoration

Dalle de verre glass, also known as faceted glass or slab glass, is a specialty glass art technique. This French term translates to "glass slab," and it originated in Paris in the 1930s. Developed by Jean Gaudin, this process uses a colored glass that's set in a matrix of proprietary epoxy. The thick glass slabs are either broken or sawed into the desired shapes and forms. The glass is then hammered on the edges to create a unique chipped look in order to better reflect natural sunlight. These glass pieces are added to a box of sand where the epoxy is poured and allowed to dry for at least 24 hours. Once dried, the glass is polished, and the resulting mosaic is either hung or installed in a window frame.

Dalle de verre glass is usually one inch thick, offering a significant depth of color that's only achieved with this glass art technique. The sparkly and luminous look from the chipped edges creates an illuminating effect, especially when contrasted by the dark epoxy background.
